November Meeting Recap

December's potluck meeting is also the month for live and silent auction fun! Silent auction contributions, such as high quality cacti, other succulents and related items are welcome. Please bring in all CCCSS library books for year's end re-inventory. Please talk to librarian Jeanne Hanysz about being a library assistant. Publicity chair Joan Field requests help with ideas for advertising our May Show and Sale in S.L.O.'s Public Library display case. Rob Skillin presented the plant of the month, winter growing 'Mesembs'. Of particular interest was the variable Conophytum from the west coast of Africa. 'Conos' flower in the fall and are dormant in the summer with papery sheaths that make them look dead. Wait until they wake before watering with continuous low moisture, rather than occasional flooding. The exception to winter growing Mesembs is the summer growing Frithia. Our speaker of the month was Mark Muradian, a cactus grower, and ceramicist, in the Fresno area of California. He brought a collection of his unique planter pottery for sale (really great pots!) and showed an outstanding, personally produced and edited HD video of his recent cactus and culture tour of Bolivia. The film was accompanied by Bolivian pan flute music that gave visceral dimension to our virtual tour through locales such as La Paz, Cochabamba, Sucre, Camargo, and Taryia. Numerous species of Lobivia, Rebutia, Trichocereus, Oreocereus, and Echinopsis, to name just a few, were filmed in native habitat, and given cultural context with a juxtaposition of local colorful culture. Particularly memorable were the women in traditional shawls and derby hats. Thank you Mr. Meridian for an outstanding multi-dimensional, virtual tour. ~Eva Zayha





SOME OF THE CHRISTMAS POTLUCK SILENT & LIVE AUCTION PLANTS



Adenium 'Shada'; free flowering, frost tender, forms caudex to 1 ft across, 5.5 in pot, 16 in tall.



Dendrocicyos socatranum; the only arborescent member of the cucumber family, lacking vines and tendrils, endemic to the island of Socotra, 2 ft tall.



Mestoklema tuberosum; a summer growing mesemb which makes a great bonsai with interesting stalk-like roots that can be raised ever higher, 10 in pot.



Beaucarnea recurvata; makes an impressive landscape plant, or bonsai, 10 in pot, 2 ft tall.



Dorstenia gigas; by far the largest of the dorstienias, from Socotra in the Gulf of Aden, 8 in pot, 1.5 ft tall.



Tylecodon paniculatus; one of the largest species, winter growing, a succulent tree to 4 ft high with golden peeling bark, 6 in pot, 12 in tall.



Conophytum obcordellum; specimen winter grower many years old, from Groot Holbak, South Africa, 3.25 in pot.



Conophytum pellucidum var cupreatum, copper-colored multi-headed specimen from Rooifontein, South Africa, 2.5 in pot.

Fenistraria, winter growing mesemb is buried to the tips of its leaves in sand dunes along the Namagualand coast, large specimen in 8 in pot.

Pachypodium lamerei, a tender tree pachypodium from Madagascar, 8 in pot, 1 ft tall.





Yucca endlichiana, small yucca with caudex-like base which can be raised for special effect, 7 in pot.







Sarcocaulon crassicaule; thick stemmed member of the geranium family, a winter grower from Namibia and northern Na-

Euphorbia gamkensis; medusoid euphorbia in 3.25
