Speakers of the Month: Bob Field


Darwin in the Garden







HISTORIC JOURNALS AND MAGAZINES:

Reid Moran, 1916 - 2010, passed away last January. He was an accomplished man in the world of succulents and researched and travelled often in Baja California, Mexico. Here is a biography about him from Desert Plant Life, February, 1957.

SANTA BARBARA BOTANIC GARDEN

Reid Moran has been appointed botanist of the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden, according to an announcement made by the director, Maunsell Van Rensselaer, his duties beginning February first.

At Stanford University where he majored in botany, Mr. Moran did a year of graduate work in botany, followed by a semester at the University of California at Berkeley and one year at Cornell. His teaching experience includes two years at Stanford and two summers at Yosemite National Park where he was ranger-naturalist, lecturing on botany, zoology and geology. He was a member of the Channel Islands Biological Survey conducted by the Los Angeles Museum.

As descriptive writer on succulents and book reviewer, Mr. Moran's name is familiar to readers of current botanical literature. During the last years of the war he was technical adviser in the preparation of a manual on air navigation. At present he is a captain in the Air Corps Reserve.

From a Santa Barbara daily have been excerpted the following paragraphs:

"While returning from a bombing mission over Steyr, Austria, Moran was shot down and reported as missing in action. It was later learned that he had parachuted to safety at Delnice, Yugoslavia, and with the aid of Tito's Partisans traveled on foot for 200 miles, partly through German controlled territory, into western Bosnia where he was picked up at night by an American C-47 and returned to Italy.

"Though confronted with constant danger of capture by the Germans, Moran's training as a field botanist led him to collect plants as he plodded along through Yugoslavia, some of which he was able to bring back to the United States."

He was awarded the D.F.C. (Distinguished Flying Cross).
