

CCCSS May Meeting Recap 5/12/2013
President Charles Varni opened the general membership meeting of CCCSS in the meeting room of the San Luis Obispo City/County Library on May 12, 2013, and welcomed our firsttime visitors and thanked the members who provided snacks for the break. All of them received a free succulent in thanks and recognition. Tee-shirts and entry cards for the upcoming show and sale were discussed and Charles presented the slate of candidates for positions on the Board of Directors.

The nominating committee recommended the following:

Members-at-Large (2) / Jim Harlow and Harry Harlow [they are not related, by the way], Hospitality / Pat Gilson, Publicity / Nancy Lynn Greene, Newsletter Editor / Terry Excell, Treasurer / Maggie Wagner, Secretary / Carol Moss, Vice-President / Kathie Matsuyama, and President / Charles Varni. Rob Skillin will remain the club's representative to CSSA. There were no nominations from the floor and the slate of candidates was elected by acclimation. We welcome our new board members, Nancy and Kathie, and thank them for volunteering their service. We also want to thank our continuing board members and the two members who resigned after years of significant service to CCCSS, Markus Mumper and Wayne Mills. SALUD!

Markus Mumper, author of this month's On the Dry Side article for the Plant-ofthe-Month, and Rob Skillin discussed Rebutia. This popular cactus comes from the Andes in South America and includes Sulcorebutia. They like sun; they tend to be winter/summer dormant, and bloom in many fabulous colors, usually beginning in spring. Backing off on watering when they are blooming seems to encourage more blooms. They are easy to take care of and require repotting in bigger pots with fresh soil as many readily form everexpanding clumps.

Other announcements included an announcement that the next auction of Charles Spotts' succulents will be later in the year. Wayne Mills put an Astrophytum on the Brag Table as an example of the quality and beauty of the plants and pots that were auctioned and encouraged attendance at the next auction. The other plants brought by members for the Plant-of-the-Month - some gorgeous blooming Rebutias, among others - and the Raffle plants were discussed. Susan Waidner reported on the new items for sale: the 2013 shirts (gorgeous!) at \$15, black tote bags with club logo at \$2, and caps, with a yet-to-bedetermined price.

Our featured speaker this month was Ken Levine, a Founding Friend of the Botanical Gardens, who presented a slide show of his trip to the Canary Islands. One of the bonuses of our meetings, and our speakers in particular, is that you often learn some fascinating random facts along with the more pertinent stuff. It was interesting to learn that the Canary Islands are actually named for dogs - canine ... canary ... get it? Canary birds are named for the Canary Islands, one set out of three sets of islands off the west coast of Africa. A somewhat odd characteristic of the climate there is a phenomenon called horizontal precipitation which is actually a type of fog that is horizontal due to the geography. The volcanic islands all lie on one fault and their "soil" is lava. Their farming is done on terraces because there is no flat land. The climate is Mediterranean. Many residents left the islands and resettled in Cuba.

The meeting was adjourned at the conclusion of the raffles.

CULTIVATION CORNER Do you want to grow plants like this?

Rob Skillin has 2 cu.ft. bags of coir available (coir is an all-natural coconut fiber). It's the loose kind – not a brick. Very easy to use and he thinks it's the best organic component for potting mixes. He is selling them at his cost - \$10/bag just to clear a bunch out. Its cheaper even that getting them at a big commercial supply warehouse like McConkey's in LA. If interested call him at 709-3033 and he will bring them to the meeting.

Coir is suitable for any type of succulent, just mix it in an appropriate proportion with the coarse drainage material (perlite or pumice). Faster growing plants can use more, slower, less. The photo is of *Gerrardanthus macrorhizus* growing in a 50/50 mix of coir and perlite.
