

### **JULY SPEAKER OF THE MONTH: ROB SKILLIN**



Socotra is the largest island in an archipelago of small islands located in the warm Indian Ocean east of the Horn of Africa. It has been recognized for centuries as a botanical wonderland, with many endemic species, including many succulents. Several of these succulent species reach massive proportions which are unheard of in other members of their genera located elsewhere. Examples are Dendrosicyos socotrana, which is the only arborescent member of the cucumber family (which also curiously lacks vines) and Dorstenia gigas, which may have a stem several feet thick and over 10' tall.

Socotra is part of the country of Yemen, which has its own interesting succulent flora. Plants on the mainland are adapted to much more arid conditions and can often tolerate colder temperatures, as they frequently occur at very high elevations.

This month's program on Yemen and its island of So-

cotra will be presented by Rob Skillin, who visited the area in the fall of 2007. It will feature habitat photos of succulents on the mainland as well as the island. It will also take a look at the very interesting culture and architecture found in the cities and rural areas of the country.

**ABOUT ROB:** I have been growing cacti and succulents for 40 years, and have been involved in various local societies for most of that time. The first office I held was Show and Sale Chairman for the Santa Barbara C&SS, during the late 1980's. After moving to California's Central Valley, I became a founding member, and later, President of the Bakersfield C&SS. In 2005, after another move, I was a founder of the Central Coast C&SS and became its first President. This society now boasts 260+ enthusiastic members, and held its very successful twelfth annual show and sale in May of 2018. I have also been involved with the CSSA as a member of its Board of Directors.

My first interest, which continues today, was cacti of the Chihuahuan desert, especially those unique genera such as Ariocarpus, Aztekium, and Strombocactus, etc. Gradually, I diversified my collection to include Mesembs, Haworthias, and other succulents, particularly caudiciforms. I've spent many years studying the cacti of the US, particularly Sclerocacti and Pediocacti. I am an avid grower of plants from seed, and now have a number of seed-grown specimens in my collection dating back to 1982. As an acknowledgment of my expertise with these plants, I have been asked to judge numerous shows throughout California, including the CSSA, Intercity, NORCAL, LA, Fresno and San Diego shows.

Along with my interest in cacti and succulents, I enjoy photography and travel. These interests have come together in a wonderful way during my botanical explorations of the western US and Mexico, and portions of South America, Africa, Madagascar and the Middle East. I have several programs based on these trips, and I speak regularly to clubs in northern and southern California. Many of my photographs have been published as illustrations for articles and covers of the Journal and Haseltonia, as well as the Timber Press Book of Succulents of the World.

### **JULY PLANT OF THE MONTH: COPIAPOA**



#### Cactaceae: Copiapoa

The genre Copiapoa consists of globular cactus that, stretching with growth, assumes tubular shape. With time, also, the new stems grow next to each other forming characteristic tufts. The plants are almost never high: they usually reach a length that can range from 30 cm to 1 m in height.

The stem has got a color of gray-green, with a peak covered by gray and thickly thorny felt. The flowers are yellow or yellow-pink, they only appear on adult plants and allow to distinguish Copiapoa among the other cacti in Chile.

Most of the special features of this plant come from the special environment where it is developed such as the Atacama Desert, considered to be the driest area in the world (it is also characterized by extremely poor soils). It is a very homogeneous area from the climatic point of view located near the coastal strip and this proximity to the sea can give the right humidity to the plant.

The copiacoa is considered a genre in itself since 1922, while previously it was part of the Echinocactus family. According to the standard classification system, there are 20 to 40 different species of Copiapoa.

The best known species is certainly the Copiapoa cinerea. This species, on its stem, produces a white cuticular wax layer which waterproofs the surface and protects it from dangerous sunburn.

Among the other species is the Copiapoa lauii, the smallest species that is known in this genre, with stems that remain of globular form and produce beautiful yellow blooms.

In Copiapoa solaris the ribs of the stem is much more noticeable than in other species and the form recalls the one of other cacti. It is very difficult to find it on the market and it has slow growth time.

The cultivation of plants of the genre Copiapoa is not easy and the growth is very slow, so they are usually difficult to find on the market.

In fact, it needs slightly different care than other cacti—even less water, especially in summer, and a soil with a mineral substrate.



#### FROM TERRY SKILLIN

Several people reminded me they wanted the recipe for slowcooked mushrooms I supplied for our open house in April. Here it is: **Slow-Cooked Mushroom Asada --** enjoy!

- 2-24 oz. containers sliced mushrooms
- 1 c. water
- 2/3 c. soy sauce
- 4 green onion, finely chopped
- the juice of one lemon or 2 limes

- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1-2 tsps red pepper flakes

Place all ingredients in a crock pot or slow roaster, stir, and cook on HIGH for 5-7 hours. Serve with a slotted spoon for the liquid to drain out.

### **JUNE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES**



She thanked members for bringing refreshments and welcomed first-time visitors (18) and invited them to introduce themselves to the group and offered free plants. She explained the different club tables, i.e. Membership, Raffle Plants, Brag Plants, Plant of the month, Library, Sales-Art/Books, Greeters, etc., set-up around the meeting room.

#### Announcements:

- By-Law Changes and vote: Rob Skillen reviewed the changes to the By-Laws that were summarized in the June Newsletter. He told the group that the attending membership needed to vote on the changes to make them official. The 75 attending members voted unanimously to approve the By-Law changes as written.
- Show and Sale: Rob Skillen thanked all the volunteers who helped make the Show and Sale this year the best ever, especially the improvement to the plant hotel at checkout! He reminded everyone that volunteered that they would be receiving thank you "Raffle Tickets" that they can use for the monthly raffles. 




