#### OAXACA


When I think of Mexico, I imagine dry sandy desert-like conditions. I also think of a drug-infested country rife with violence that spills out into the streets making it dangerous for residents and visitors alike. Much to my surprise and delight, Oaxaca was none of the above. It is an area filled with extraordinary bio-diversity and with residents who are warm and welcoming.

Our travel group was able to find numerous botanical niches that contained a large number of different and distinctive cacti and succulents. We will take a tour of these areas and investigate the plant life that exists in each of them. We also had the opportunity to enjoy some of the local culture and visit some of the wonderful artisans and the local mescal breweries.

I will also supplement our look at the botanical wonders of Oaxaca, by visiting some select sites in Brazil which also support an incredible amount of bio-diversity.

Steve Frieze has been involved with collection, sales and propagation of cacti and succulents for over thirty years. He is a lifetime member of the Los Angeles Cacti and Succulent Society where he served as the President of this club for a number of years and as its newsletter editor for several more. He was a co-managing partner of Desert Creations, an exotic cactus and succulent plant store and is currently one of three partners in Floratopia, in a new exotic plant venture.

Steve and his wife Phyllis have made several plant related expeditions to exotic locals such as Chile, East Africa, South Africa, Oaxaca Mexico, Cost Rica, and Brazil. Prior to his retirement, he was an Administrator for the California State University system, serving in a variety of capacities in the area of institutional research. #### AUCTION PLANTS STILL NEEDED!



# **CSSA CONVENTION UPDATES**

New 2019 CSSA Convention VOLUNTEERS need to go on-line to Sign-UP for their specific day/time spots!

THANK YOU to those who have already signed up for their volunteer slots!

We still need many "Cashiers" and "Cashier Assistants" – which are CSSA's names for what our CCCSS Show/Sale calls "Pre-Check"... count up the plants/pots, fill-out the forms, and that gets passed on to the Card-operators. (CSSA needs Card-Operators, too!)

- If you have not already volunteered, you should go to <u>cssaconvention.com</u> and click on DAILY SCHEDULE (from list across the top of the site) to see each day's activities, and can decide when you want to use your Day-Pass (earned by working a full 4-5 hour shift) to attend the presentations.
- Then use the LINK near the bottom of YOUR INVITATION to sign into <u>signup.com</u>, fill in your name, e-mail and phone, and select the work day/shift/job you want to do at the Convention (invitations were resent a couple weeks ago, plus new ones, as some had been lost).

# MAY PLANT OF THE MONTH: ADROMISCHUS

The genus Adromischus is endemic to South Africa and Namibia. The species from this genus are perennial, herbaceous, succulent plants that grow upright to down lying reaching a height of up to ten inches with short, thick, recumbent stems densely covered with rusty-red aerial roots that absorb moisture from the air and that support thick, fleshy leaves that grow in clumps arranging themselves in the shape of rosettes.

These succulents bloom in summer with generally small flowers with a greenish-white tube and pink or reddish corolla and produce sufficient nectar to start a fungal infection or attract aphids, especially towards the end of the growing season. As the flowers are not showy, many growers cut off the developing flower stems to avoid plant health issues. The only species worth growing for its flowers is Adromischus phillipsii which has relatively large showy orange tubular flowers reminiscent of those of Cotyledons to which Adromischus is closely related and with which it was once grouped.

Cultural information should only be used as a guide, and should be to be adapted to suit you; Your physical location, where you grow your plants, how much time you have to devote to their care and many other factors will need to be taken into account. Only then can you decide on the cultural methods that best suit you and your plants.



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Top right: *Andromischus triforis* Left: *Andromischus marianiae* Bottom right: *Andromischus montium-klinghardtii* 




## **ADROMISCHUS – CONTINUED**

Light: Adromischus like full sun to bring out their true colors. A loction where the plant can receive a lot of light, but not necessarily full sun, is recommended. If you grow indoors you need to leave them near a sunny window. The direct sunlight could, however, wrinkle the leaves so it is important to check that the plant is not under the sun for many hours a day.

**Temperature:** Adromischus thrive in warm environments but they also grow well at moderate temperatures. Adromischus tolerate cool, frost-free conditions during the winter if kept dry. It is as well to keep water off the foliage during the winter.

**Soil:** As usual many species are easy to grow in any free-draining soil. Repotting is not necessary to increase the size of the plants (unless one wishes to develop in width) but it is useful to keep them in good health and to slow aging.



Watering: Regular watering in the summer (approximately every two weeks), scarce in winter (once per month). But if the plant is located indoors it will need to be watered more frequently to resist environmental dryness.

Fertilizer: Fertilizer can be limited to the growing season. They can be fed from spring to autumn once a month, in the autumn and winter do not feed the plants.

**Rest period:** The dormant period of the plant comes in the winter. At this time, it is recommended to place Adromischus in a bright, cool place and rarely water.

**Propagation:** Many species can be propagated from a single leaf which should be placed against the side of the pot so that the stem end is just touching the compost. Some species drop their leaves easily and although each leaf will form a new plant it can be a challenge to grow a large specimen. In other cases, leaves for propagation must be carefully detached with a sharp knife.



- Garden Gatherings/Events (over 30 participants): Discussed refreshment cost for events with over 30 participants.






