
#### MARCH GUEST SPEAKER: ERNESTO SANDOVAL

Ernesto Sandoval has been wondering and seeking questions to why plants grow and look the way that they do for a long time. Now he explains and interprets the world of plants to a variety of ages and experiences from K-12 to professionals as well as Master Gardeners. He regularly lectures to a variety of western Garden Clubs throughout the year and particularly to Succulent Clubs throughout California. Desert plants are his particular passion within his general passion for plants. Ernesto thoroughly enjoys helping others, and gardeners in particular, to understand why and how plants do what they do.

When he was about 13 he asked his dad why one tree was pruned a particular way and another tree another way. His dad answered bluntly, "Because that's the way you do it." Since then he's been learning and teaching himself the answers to those and many other questions by getting a degree at UC Davis in Botany and working from student weeder/waterer to Director over the last 25 years at the UC Davis Botanical Conservatory.

By helping people to understand the workings of plants he hopes to help us better understand how and why our plants do what they do and how we can maximize their growth with less effort.

Ernesto's program supports Rob Skillin's seedling distribution and will cover "Caring for the Small & the Young (Seedling Succulents)."

#### MARCH PLANT OF THE MONTH: DIOSCOREA ELEPHANTIPES

**Origin:** Cape of Good Hope, South Africa including the Western and Eastern Cape.

**Habitat and ecology:** This species has a wide tolerance of growing habitats growing in weathered rock, on dry, stony slopes, under the protection of karroid (living in the Karoo desert) bushes, etc. Pollination is done by bees and bumble bees. The plant is adapted to growing in areas with seasonal rainfall; in its natural environment it rests during the hot dry summer. Dioscorea elephantipes grows in the Winter and Spring months. The above ground caudex is protected by elephantine bark. It is used to extreme heat (above 100°F), but it can also take low temperatures (0°C). This plant can be grown outside in the ground in most parts of the County.

**Common names include:** Turtleback, Tortoise Plant, Tortoise Back Plant, Elephant foot, turtle back, elephant's foot, Hottentots' bread

**Description:** The elephant foot, Dioscorea elephantipes, is a perennial deciduous caudiciform vine belonging to the monocot yam family (Dioscoreaceae). The enlarged, exposed tuberous base is a waterstoring organ called a caudex. The caudex most often reaches a diameter of 2 - 3 feet, but sometimes 9 or more feet, and is covered in tough armor-like plates. It produces a seasonal clinging growth up to 20 feet long. The leaves are heart-shaped. It bears small insignificant yellowish green flowers.

**Derivation of name:** Dioscorea is named after the ancient Greek physician and botanist Dioscorides, elephantipes in Latin refers to the elephant-like appearance on the outer covering of the bark.


**Caudex:** The large and partially exposed tuberous stem is woody-looking, firm in texture but succulent within and covered on the outside with thick greyish-brown bark that becomes deeply cracked.


**Remarks:** The inner flesh is rich in starch and edible, hence the name Hottentot bread, here in the States this would be very expensive and also should probably not be tried at home. This species was once nearly eradicated in the wild during the search for commercially

valuable sources of steroidal saponins like diosgenin, used to synthesize cortisone and birth control pills. Fortunately, removal of plants from their habitat proved difficult and as cheaper and more viable sources of these steroids became available, collection efforts ceased.






