



PLANT OF THE MONTH

PSEUDOLITHOS

Pseudolithos grows in full sun and require very little fertiliser and water. The name literally means "false stone".

The genus Pseudolithos grows in countries along the Arabian Sea, from Africa to the Arabian Peninsula: Somalia, Yemen and Oman. They generally grow in gritty soils in dry, tropical environment, with plenty of sunlight.

These plants have a single stem or a little

bunch of stems, with a pitted surface, looking almost like a stone with a very irregular top: this is an effect given by the numerous tubercles at the base of the stem. They don't exceed 2-7 centimeters in height. This feature, together with their lumpy appearance, make them really sought after by succulent collectors. Stems are tetra - angular or globose (like in P. migiurtinus) and can be bluish-green or light brown, 1 to 5 centimeters long and 1-6 millimeters wide.

Leaves are reduced to scales, and the photosynthesis is carried out by the stems.

Some species also have ribs, including P. migiurtinus, one of the most popular varieties on the market.

Flowers grow on these stems, on the top of them or along them depending on the species. They tend to be small and dark in colour: red, grey, purple. They spread an unpleasant odor that attracts pollinating insects, usually flies.

VARIETY AND TYPES

These are the species recognized to date:

- P. caput-viperae
- P. cubiformis
- P. dodsonianus
- P. horwoodii
- P. mccoyi
- P. migiurtinus
- P. sphaericus

PLANT OF THE MONTH - cont'd

TIPS FOR GROWING

Easy to grow and root, this succulent needs very little attention, however any mistake can be costly.

- It prefers a half-sun position: bright, but sheltered from direct sunlight.
- Pseudolithos are plants native to warm climates and it is good to keep them always at a temperature above 8-10 °C.
- Water every 3-4 days in spring and summer, always waiting for the soil to dry well before proceeding. In autumn and winter, watering must be less frequent but should't be suspended
- Use a standard soil for succulent plants, or another well-draining and very light soil (for example, mixing a universal substrate with some sand).
- Fertilize once a month with a product rich in microelements but poor in nitrogen.
- Repotting can be done every 2-3 years, not more frequently.

Brag Plants/Plant of the Month & Raffle plants were all discussed by Rob Skillin. Thanks to everyone who brought in plants to share.

Presentation: Nick Wilkinson, from Grow Nursery in Cambria, discussed how to stage your plants for entry into a plant Show. Highlights from the presentation:

- Nick encouraged everyone who has not entered plants into the Show, to do so this year.
- One tip is to try to match the texture of the plant to that of the pot.
- Attempting to match the plants growth in habitat to a pot is also a strategy. For example, a plant growing out of the side of a pot, could mimic it's growth on a cliffside.



- Remember that Novice growers will be competing with other Novice growers.
- Some planting tips:
 - Don't put the plant too low in the pot.
 - Cover the hole in the pot with window screen.
 - Water a plant several days to a week before the Show. Not the day before or the day of the Show!
 - Central Coast Landscape Products in SLO and Meyer Bros in AG both sell top dressing.
- <u>Most important tip for success</u>: It's about the plant. Bring a nice, clean, well grown plant in a clean pot.

BOD meeting:

- In person meeting went well today. Having snacks outside was nice. People got to mingle and socialize.
- CCCSS participated in the SLO Botanical Garden event & the Greenhouse Growers event at NHS. Both events attracted lots of people. Information about CCCSS meetings and our upcoming S&S were distributed.
- Loring Manley volunteered to cover the Publicity for the Show & Sale. Any suggestions or help with this task would be appreciated by Loring.
- Pat secured additional tables needed for the S&S from the Mineral Society.
- T-shirt update: As soon as the deposit is made, shirts will be printed. They should be available at the May meeting.
- There was discussion about our ability to video the live meetings adequately with the equipment that the Club currently owns. Loring will do some research on this matter to see what we might need (and at what cost) to provide a quality experience for remote viewers.




CCCSS ASK US: WE WILL TRY TO HELP!!

Due to the overwhelming number of ASK US requests, you must be an <u>Active Member of CCCSS</u> to participate.

Examples of issues we may be able to help with include:

- ID of Plants
 - Provide 3 photos of the plant: 1) close-up of leaves, flowers, spines; 2) general photo of the plant with something in the photo that indicates scale....a ruler, soda can or credit card; and 3) a photo of the plant in its environment (is the plant in full sun, under a porch, planted in the landscape?)
- Watering & Light Requirements
- Feeding & Fertilization
- Pests & Problems
- Soil & Amendments
- Propagation


A Call for Auction Plants:




