### **CCCSS Meeting minutes summaries November 13 2022**

Regular Meeting: 75 attendees

- President's remarks:
  - Our guest speaker will be our own Bill Findley and Loring Manley to discuss plant propagation. Our scheduled speaker, Ernesto Sandoval is ill and will reschedule.
  - The BOD will be considering the following proposal:
    - Susan Chandler's daughter, Maggie, has offered to fund a project for CCCSS. The proposal being worked on is a "Youth Award" to be given out at our S&S. The details will be worked out by the BOD and the S&S Committee. The purpose of the award would be to encourage young people to get involved in our Club by entering plants in our S&S. There would be a small cash prize to encourage participation. Details to follow...
    - Parents and grandparents are encouraged to assist the young folks in your life to get involved with growing cactus and succulents.
  - The BOD will also be considering donating to two worthy causes:
    - The Botanical Garden has requested help with the purchase of Aloe ferox for a large planting at the Garden.
    - Also under consideration is a contribution to CSSA for their Conservation or Research funds.
  - Please remember that all CCCSS members are welcome to attend and participate in the BOD meetings which are held directly after the regular meeting is cleaned up.

- Mary Peracca announced that she will be selling pottery at a "Hands Across Nepal" event in Santa Margarita on Sat. Nov 19<sup>th</sup> in Santa Margarita. 14 vendors will be present.
- Mike Bush announced that Los Osos group of potters/growers will be having a Holiday Gift Sale at their 9<sup>th</sup> street location in Los Osos on Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup>.
- Holiday Party: Our Holiday potluck will be December 11<sup>th</sup> at the Odd Fellows Hall. The Club will provide the ham and turkey. Please sign up with Pat to bring additional potluck items.
  - There will also be a silent and a live auction. The silent auction items can be anything cactus/succulent related. Including plants/pots, books, gift items. For live auction plants please contact Bill Findley. He would like to see a picture and he can help you set a price. Silent auction items are 100% donation to the Club. Live auction plants are 75%/25% split, with 25% to the Club.
- Plants were distributed to folks who brought refreshments, helped with clean up and also to those who were attending our meeting for the first time.
- The Show & Sale Committee will be having their first planning meeting on Feb 5<sup>th</sup>. Please let Harry know if you are interested in being on the committee.
- Bill Findley & Loring Manley presented a well done review of propagation techniques. Bill reviewed types of propagation: sexual (pollination/seed production), leaf cuttings, and asexual (cloning). Loring emphasized the

importance of sanitation, warmth and lighting to encourage seed growth. Bill and Loring would like to start up a propagation group to work together on these techniques to grow your plants from seeds. Anyone interested in participating in this group, please contact Bill or Loring.

### **BOD Meeting:**

- Treasurer's Report: All taxes and fees have been paid.
  - The need for a budget plan was discussed. Kathy will research and return to the BOD with a proposed budget.
- Funding proposals:
  - Maggie made a proposal to fund the planting of the Aloe ferox plants at the SLOBG. Her request was granted.

- Pat has ordered the meat for the Dec potluck.
- Bill mentioned that the document camera which the Club recently purchased worked well for today's presentation.

Would you like to sell an item?


The auction is open to all club members to sell a cactus/succulent plant, artwork including pottery at this auction. You must be a member to sell.



### **Program: Huntington Happenings**

This program will bring you up to date on new developments at the Huntington Botanical Gardens, notably the upper Desert Garden renovation. This includes new, accessible paths opening another halfacre of garden to the public. Also, the Desert Garden Conservatory renovation will have been completed in late 2022. Plants will be moving back in before winter after their summer vacation back in the nursery. Meanwhile, the collections have been carrying on with their usual, and some not-so-usual, activities. This program documents some highlights of all this activity with fascinating flowers and forms of some of your favorite plants as well as some that may be new to you. I look forward to taking you on the tour.



Biography: John Trager is the Bernie and Miyako Storch Curator of Desert Collections at the Huntington Botanical Gardens in San Marino, California where he has worked since 1983. Prior to that he worked with master propagator Frank Horwood at Abbey Garden Nursery when it was in Carpinteria. Trager's horticultural writings have appeared in the Cactus and Succulent Journal, the Euphorbia Journal, and various other horticultural publications. He is also known for his photography -- over 3000 of his images have been published in numerous textbooks and horticultural journals. Book projects include coauthorship and photography for Dry Climate Gardening with Succulents produced by the Huntington (1995), principal photographer for The Genus Conophytum (1993) and a contributor to other works by Steven Hammer: Lithops, Treasures of the Veld (1999) and Dumpling and His Wife (2002, a revision of the The Genus Conophytum) and Mesembs of the World (1998, Smith, Hammer et al.). He has also contributed photographs to works by Gordon Rowley: The Succulent Compositae (1994), Anacampseros, Avonia, Grahamia: a Grower's Handbook (1995), Crassula, A Grower's Guide (2003), as well as the multiauthored six-volume reference The Illustrated Handbook of Succulents (2001-2003). He continues to contribute images for new editions and new publications as opportunity and demands arise. The annual ISI introductions published in the CSSA Journal also provide a venue for his writing and photography. John has traveled widely in search of plants (and insects) including China, Costa Rica, Israel, Mexico, Namibia, South Africa, Thailand, and Venezuela. He holds a bachelor's degree in Horticulture from Cal Poly Pomona (1992) and earlier studied Botany at Santa Barbara City College and UCSB.



As always, the convention program will include national and international renowned speakers on cactus and succulent topics of interest to all attendees. Comradery with old and new friends, field trips to visit remarkable gardens along the Front Range, visits to wild cactus populations and trips and of course world class vendors with both common and rare cacti and succulents for sale.

All of us look forward to seeing you in Colorado Springs from July 12th to the 16th, 2023.






