SHOW RULES

(see additional terms in "Definitions" link on website)

1. The Central Coast Cactus and Succulent Society Show is a competitive, judged show, with 4 Categories of exhibitors; Open, Advanced, Novice and Youth.
2. The show is open to anyone with an interest in succulent plants.
3. All entries will be placed in the appropriate class with a completed entry card by the exhibitor:
 - The Judging Committee may combine categories, rearrange the plants, or move plants to different categories to improve the show.
4. Entries must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least 6 months prior to the show.
5. Grafted plants will be accepted in any class, and must be so indicated on the entry card.
6. With the exception of dish gardens, there may be only one plant per pot.
7. All plants must be free of pests and disease, and be in presentable condition. The Judging Committee may remove any unsuitable for the show.
8. The Central Coast Cactus and Succulent Society will not assume responsibility for loss or injury to property.

AWARDS

- Ribbons will be given for First, Second, and Third place in each plant class for each category of entry (Novice, Advanced, Open, Youth)
- Best Cactus and Best Succulent in each category of entry (Novice, Advanced, Open) will be listed on permanent trophies
- Special rosettes will be given for Outstanding Specimens chosen by the Judges' Clerks
